- Introduction:



The National Palace Museum, located in Taipei, Taiwan, has a permanent collection of nearly 700,000 pieces of ancient Chinese imperial artifacts and artworks, making it one of the largest of its type in the world.

The collection encompasses 8,000 years of history of Chinese art from the Neolithic age to the modern. Most of the collection are high quality pieces collected by China's emperors. The National Palace Museum shares its roots with the Palace Museum in the Forbidden City, whose extensive collection of artwork and artifacts were built upon the imperial collections of the Ming and Qing dynasties.

- Sanxia Old Street

Sanxia is a traditional district located in northern Taiwan. Walking in the old town, you may visit several shops of handcrafts, folk toy, hand-made blue dye, tea cultures, and other souvenirs.

- Yingge Ceramics Museum

The first ceramics museum in Taiwan is located in Yingge district in Taipei. It is dedicated to the research, curation, preservation, and maintenance of Taiwan's ceramics culture and art while performing work in exhibition and education.

- Xiao Long Bao (Steamed dumplings) DIY

Xiaolongbao, which were supposedly invented by a street vendor in the late 19th century, have become so popular that they are a Chinese food icon in Asia and around the world. Through a DIY tutoring by chefs, you can make your own Xiao Long Bao and taste on-site.

## Local Tour – B 【 Yangmingshan National Park 】

- **Zhongxing Guesthouse**

The Zhongxing Guesthouse also known as the Yangmingshuwu is a historical site located in Yangmingshan National Park in the Beitou District of Taipei. It was constructed between 1969 and 1970 by late Republic of China President Chiang Kai-shek for reception of important foreign guests and to act as a summer residence. It was designed by architect Huang Baoyu, who also designed the National Palace Museum.

- **Jing Shan Recreation Area**

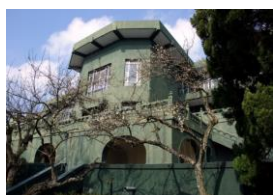
Located in Yangmingshan National Park, with the energy springs from Qixing Mountain, it is the only hot spring recreational area in Yangmingshan National Park. At the same time, it has facilities such as restaurants, cabins, camping areas, SPA houses etc.

- **Lengshuikeng**

The Lengshuikeng region is a low-lying depression which was created when the lava from Mt. Qixing and Mt. Qigu formed a barrage. Water then accumulated, turning the area into a lake, which eventually leaked out and dried up to expose the lake bottom and form today's landscape. The water temperature of the hot springs in this area only reaches 40°C (104°F), far below that of other springs in other areas, hence its name Lengshuikeng, which means "cold water pit".

- **Xiaoyoukeng**

Xiaoyoukeng is a post-volcanic geological landscape area and is located on Mt. Qixing's northwestern foot. The scenic trail can be reached by turning right on the Xiaoguan Yin stop on Yangjin Highway. It is approximately 805 meters above sea level and is famed for the fumaroles, sulfur crystals, hot springs and spectacular 'landslide terrain' formed by post-volcanic activity.
