Guidelines for PPSEAWA USA Scholarship Award

(last 2 years of secondary school, which is 11th and/or 12th year)

- to be given by **PPSEAWA-USA** to a young woman who resides in one of the nations having a PPSEAWA National Member Orgnaization as listed below.
- Whatever monies are allocated for this scholarship or scholarships (we might be able to give two) will be given **directly to the school** that the candidate attends or the school district superintendent or school council. Each scholarship will not exceed \$1000.00 USD, payable in U.S. funds.
- 2. The candidate/recipient must **finish with honors** in the first year of the grant (presuming it is a two-year grant) before being awarded the second year's money.
- 3. **No monies** will be given directly to the student or her family.
- 4. Her school principal and/or Selection Committee must recommend each candidate. She should demonstrate intellectual ability, focused performance, moral integrity, extracurricular activity and be community minded.
- 5. If the candidate comes from a small village/town, the Selection Committee should consist of village elders and/or any-nonpolitical professionals (doctors, lawyers).
- 6. Candidates should NOT be related to anyone on the Selection Committee.
- 7. No monies will be given to the school to be attended until the scholarship **recipient is registered and enrolled**. Bursar's receipt or equivalent is requested.
- 8. PPSEAWA USA requires a **report from the student/and school after the first year**.
- 9. Decide how much more education would be needed by the candidate to meet her goals.
- 10. PPSEAWA-USA hopes that the scholarship recipient, after finishing school, remains in her own country.
